## **Chesapeake Crossroads Sees Change and Growth in 2023**

In 2023, the heritage area completed some significant updates: we adopted a new Five-Year Plan, approved a new set of Interpretive Themes, and we legally changed our name (to Chesapeake Crossroads Heritage Area, Inc.) We also got to work on new goals.

One goal is to support new partners in the grant application process, and this year, four new partner organizations received funding from the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority (out of seven), and four new organizations received Mini-Grant funding (out of twelve).

We are also hard at work on our goal to increase our technical assistance to partners, offering new workshops to inform and train stakeholders.

In 2023, we hosted four workshops/ webinars: an in-person workshop about our Interpretive Themes; a webinar about the National Register process in Maryland; a webinar about local marketing partnerships; and a webinar version of our annual grant-writing workshop. ## **Grants Awarded in 2023**

In 2023, the Chesapeake Crossroads Heritage Area brought \$470,273 in funding to capital and non-capital projects at heritage sites, museums, and non-profit organizations in our area, as well as three grants to the Chesapeake Crossroads Heritage Area, which include support for our important Mini-Grant program. These fully-matched grants leveraged more than \$2,341,783 in total project costs.
